**59 families**

*residing the camp lack the basics of shelter as a result of their displacement due to the war.*

**1 child**

*lost his life in the camp due to the lack of safe lighting needs.*

**2 mat dwellings**

*in the camp was burnt due to the use of fire to get lighting.*

**Aims of Intervention**

- Providing the appropriate protection to the IDPs, especially children and women, in the camp in which they are likely to be subject to many dangers due to the darkness including but not limited to poisonous snakes and lizards, or fires.
- Helping the camp residents to manage their lives.
- Enhancing resilience in the Yemeni countryside and in the most vulnerable and needy areas to cost-effective energy sources.
- Contributing to improving the living environment of the displaced people in the camp so they can lead their lives normally.

*The Project Impact It enhanced the sense of psychological security for children and women, contributed to alleviating the suffering of the camp residents, and enabled them to continue their night-life activities normally.*

### Project Activities:

- Coordinating with the Executive Unit for IDPs Camps Management in Taiz Gov.
- Coordinating with the Office of Social Affairs and Labor in Taiz Gov.
- Coordinating with the Shelter Cluster in Taiz Gov.
- Forming the project team.
- Field survey and selection of beneficiaries.



- Preparing the beneficiaries data base.
- Making and analyzing the offer quotes.
- Supplying and transporting the materials
- Checking the materials (the solar power systems).
- Launching the project in the presence of the Officer of the Executive Unit in the District.
- Installing the solar systems, connecting networks to the camp residents' homes, and testing the installation and lighting process.



**The components of the solar system unit supplied to the camp:**

A 100-watt panel, a 50-amp gel battery, a 300-watt power converter, a 20-volt regulator, a 20-meter long electric wire, 3 light bulbs and their sockets, a roll of wire for the internal network, in addition to an iron base to install the solar panel outside.



## Recommendations:

Pay attention to the needs of the remote and hard-to-reach IDP camps, and target their residents with the humanitarian activities and interventions implemented by organizations and foundations to alleviate the suffering of the residents there. There are (11) IDP camps that still need lighting projects, according to the statement of the Executive Unit for the IDPs Camps Management in Taiz Governorate, these camps can be summarized as follows: (Al-Rajhi camp, Manaqil camp, Al-Rawda camp, Al-Najd camp, Al-Rubaiq camp, Al-Muneij camp, Al-Rahba camp, Al-Hajb camp, Al-Hajeej camp, Al-Hasbari camp, and Wadi Al-Shat camp).

The Foundation calls on all organizations to respond to the distress call, especially in light of the new displacement movement from Al-Hodeidah areas, which reached 280 families in Al-Makha City, and 48 families in the Al-Shamayatein District.
